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My dear Father

This last embarkation to the Cordillera was nearly concluding my career in this world of trouble & strife, notwithstanding the success I had to contend with from Wed. Nov. 22: we had 30 super most intense colds for four days - the thermometer at times standing at 44° - farther heat - with hail & rain - I started from the mine at one o'clock P.M. on Saturday arrived at Santa at 1 P.M. - Sunday morning more dead than living with an emergency attendance that we had discovered one of the most rich & extensive & rich mines in Chile composed of quick silver & silver - but by losses made by the mint & Varguer's hour weighing & disappointment we found that the metals contained lead & a portion of quick silver - but not enough to make it pay - when at once my grand hopes of becoming independent of an ungoverned & unjust government at least towards me vanish? like smoke in the air. The Varguer was 1/3 of the richness of the mine I had taken out some twenty fathom out
