

Santiago March 12th 1846. 7.

My dear Felix -

I have returned from the Rio
 de Janeiro mine of the Chilean province. I have
 & I have to say to my return from this mine
 I have been to visit that the Chilean has been
 cutting these roads in the rich large of
 the valley, rather than I should have been
 in the desert place for the last two months.
 He has been leading me in with eyes focusing
 me with metals which he said that he had
 extracted from two new notes that he had
 discovered in the Hill last last month - & that
 each note was from one year to one half
 in breadth - & that in about time he would
 have rich metals brought to lower all
 expenses he has been about fifteen days
 & I not having from him I was determined
 to judge for my self. Consequently I got
 in and I will have mines from Chile
 to accompany me to the Rio de Janeiro
 mine which we visited after noon & half -
 I passed over the worst roads that ever was
 traveled in Chile - and mining at Rio de Janeiro
 & examining them with in every direction the
 miners told me that they were nothing
